Each student group, under the instruction of Assistant Professor M. Michael Zuckerman, JD, MBA, was asked to define and analyze three cyber exposures to loss that the typical integrated health system, financial services, or pharmaceutical firm must try to control and finance. They were not only required to define the exposures in terms of frequency and severity, but also recommend strategies that include risk control, risk financing, and even alternative risk transfer solutions.
