Halloween Hazards

While homeowners and renters insurance are not usually the first thing that comes to mind on Halloween they should be for risk management and actuarial science students. The holiday increases liability exposures for renters and owners alike. To limit your exposure consider the following tips:

1. It is best to make sure the dog is busy or stays away from the door, the least tasty Halloween treat is a liability claim caused by the dog.
2. Practice extreme caution with candles. While the effect of bright orange candle adds to the atmosphere of Halloween, candles can cause a fire if not placed and monitored carefully.
3. Light pathways for Trick or Treaters and party guests. In addition, keep all electric cords out of the walkway. Trips and falls are the most common causes of insurance liability claims.
4. In an attempt to reduce the possibility of a lawsuit, it is recommended to refrain from such tactics as suddenly jumping from behind bushes or acts of intimidation like screaming. These tactics can be a great source of amusement in a fun house or amusement park, but they expose homeowners and renters to another source of liability.
5. If steps one through four seem too daunting, or if you were planning on having a man killing dog scare strangers by jumping out of bushes and arranging thousands of candles in the house, you may want to think about purchase additional coverage. Homeowners and renters can call their insurance agent to find out what it will cost to increase their liability limits to cover the increased exposure of the holiday.
