Courses Through Gamma

BA 2101

All undergraduate students in the Fox School of Business and Management are required to take the one-credit hour course, BA 2101 – Professional Development Strategies. Both Actuarial Science and RMI majors have the option to enroll in a special, GIS administered section of BA 2101 to fulfill this requirement. To complete BA 2101 through GIS, students must:

- •Be a dues paid member of Gamma Iota Sigma for the current academic year.
- Attend the H. Wayne Snider Distinguished Guest Lecturer Series each Wednesday from 12:00pm to 12:50pm and complete a Critical Listening Sheet.
- Join a committee within GIS and attend meetings held every other Monday from 12:00pm to 12:50pm.
- •Meet the requirements to be included in the GIS Resume Book.
- Attend a "Getting Started" Workshop with CSPD or provide proof that you are CSPD certified.

RMI 3682


GIS offers another one-credit hour independent study course in professional development. Actuarial Science or RMI majors who have completed BA 2101 (either through GIS or Fox) are eligible to enroll in this course. To complete RMI 3682, students must:

- Be a dues paid member of Gamma Iota Sigma for the current academic year.
- Attend the H. Wayne Snider Distinguished Guest Lecturer Series each Wednesday from 12:00pm to 12:50pm and complete a Critical Listening Sheet.
- Participate in one GIS community service event during the semester.

To enroll in either course, students must sign up during the first organizational meeting AND attend orientation for BA 2101/RMI 3682 on **Friday**, **September 4, 2020 via Zoom**. The course syllabus will be distributed at this orientation, and there will be a contract that must be signed.
