The boy who cried... Hurricanes?

With Hurricane Ike set to travel nearly the length of Cuba this past Monday, before heading into the Gulf of Mexico, residents from Texas to Florida faced another week of worrying about whether their communities would fall in the storm's path. Some public officials said Sunday they were concerned that the frequency of hurricanes this year may cause coastal residents to ignore orders to evacuate or stock supplies as Ike approaches. In Houston, a number of residents said they are among those experiencing hurricane warning fatigue. "There are so many names coming by - it's Gustav, then Hanna, then Ike," said Andy Berma, a medical office manager who relocated to Houston from Chicago two months ago. "It's like a herd of animals coming at you. It seems like the media needs something to talk about." At 10 p.m. CDT Sunday Sept 6th, Ike was a Category 3 hurricane with top sustained winds of 120 mph. It was centered near Cabo Lucretia, Cuba, about 135 miles east of Camaguey, and moving westward at 13 mph. Forecasting models predicted that it would hit anywhere from northern Mexico to the Florida Panhandle. But several models called for it most likely to strike between



Texas' upper coast and eastern Louisiana. Ike is the third storm to threaten Houston this year, with many residents questioning the warnings. So the question begs, when does the hurricane warning become wearily received? Is the potential catastrophe worth the caution? Can crying hurricanes create the same result as crying wolves? When does enough warning become too much?

He is also executive director of the American Association of Managing General Agents (AAMGA), representing the premier MGA agents writing \$23.9 billion of premium, insurers, reinsurers, law firms, and other companies

in the wholesale insurance distribution .marketplace; and the American Association of Independent Claim Professionals (AAICP). Mr. Heinze has served as Vice-President and Chief Litigation Counsel for a Fortune 500 Insurance Company, where he was responsible for the management of all property and casualty litigation nationwide, the converged network of outside panel and 12 staff counsel operations of the company, and its environmental and mass tort, compliance and bad faith units, and an over \$120 million annual budget.

Mr. Heinze graduated with a BA in International Relations and Economics from the Canisius College (1978) in Buffalo, NY, and obtained his Juris Doctor degree with honors from the Temple University School of Law (1983) where he was editor in chief of the law school magazine. He is licensed to practice before the United States and Pennsylvania Supreme Courts, and the federal courts of Pennsylvania. Prior to his legal practice, he was legislative assistant to Congressman Jack

Kemp in the Washington, DC office, and executive assistant and deputy press secretary to Erie County (NY) Executive Edward J. Rutkowski. He also worked as weekend anchor for WAVA NewsRadio in Washington, DC.
