It taught me leadership skills, taught me how to manage my time effectively, and how to handle stressful situations and multitask.


"Why It's Time to Retire the 401(k)" Guest *Risky Business* Writer: Sean O'Connel

In a recent <u>Time Magazine</u> article, Stephen Gandel tries to evaluate the usefulness of 401(k)s and their relative success or failure since their inception nearly three decades ago. He argues that pension plans offer employees greater financial security in retirement. The issue with this is that pensions are no longer a viable option for companies to provide to employees as they are extremely taxing financially for the employer.

Gandel argues that 401(k)s should be just one of a number of parts of a retirement plan for employees. The downside of 401(k)s are that they are extremely dependent upon the current market

conditions when it is time to retire, no matter how long you have been making contributions to it. A solution to this is some better form of retirement insurance that can make returns on invested income more stable over time. The inherent problem is that retiring and drawing on a 401k during a recession is bad for the retiree, making them want to delay retirement. At the same time, a recession is a time when there are a lot more forced retirements as companies try to downsize and cut costs.
