Mark J. Freedman is a Principal of Ernst & Young, a global accounting firm with a large actuarial consulting practice. Prior to that, he worked at Philadelphia Life Insurance Company.

His most recent experience has been in financial reporting (U.S. and international), regulatory reporting, forecasting of earnings and capital, mergers and acquisitions, and financial modeling. Before that, he developed life and health products and performed pension valuations as an enrolled actuary. Freedman holds a Bachelor of Arts in Mathematics from the University of Pennsylvania.

Freedman is a Chair of the SOA's Strategic Plan Task Force, whose charge is to develop a long-term strategic plan. He sits on a U.S. based actuarial organization task force, charged with developing a roadmap to formulate or affirm the optimal structure of the U.S. based profession. Freedman also serves on the SOA's Consolidation Task Force and has served as a Vice President / Secretary & Treasurer on the Board of Directors for the SOA. He has represented the SOA on the Insurance Accounting Committee of the International Actuarial Association.

Freedman served on the Life Operating Committee of the Actuarial Standards Board. He served as Chair of the Financial Reporting Section Council of the SOA. Freedman has presented at insurance industry functions, including at many SOA meetings, seminars, and teaching sessions and is a past President of the Actuaries Club of Philadelphia. He has co-authored the SOA's textbook, U.S. GAAP for Life Insurers – Second Edition and serves on the Board of Directors of a police pension fund.

Actuarial Science Intern Reception

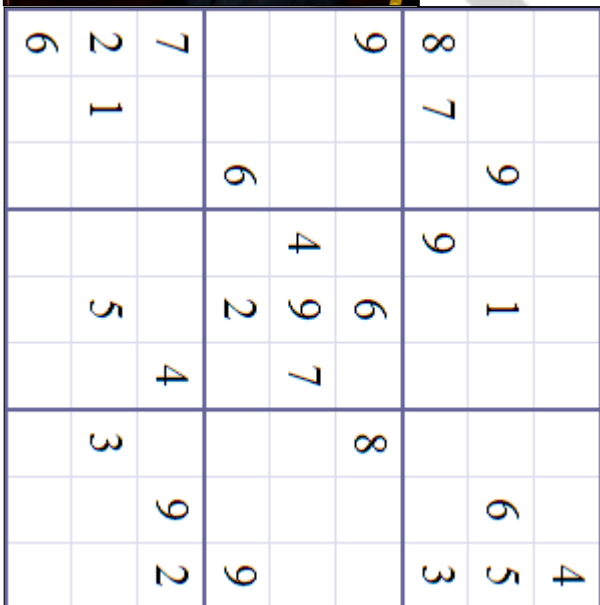
Thursday, November 7, 2013 - 1-6PM - Alter Hall 7th Floor MBA Commons
