Ms. Salter has over 25 years of insurance experience in the insurance industry. Prior to joining Jefferson Health System in September 2002 she was a Managing Director for Marsh, Philadelphia in the Client Service area. At Marsh, Ms. Salter provided brokerage, risk management consulting, and account management services focusing on large healthcare clients. An area of significant expertise was in the creation of alternative risk financing vehicles (trusts, captives, risk retention groups) for healthcare clients to fund their medical malpractice and general liability losses.

Founded in 1995, the non-profit Jefferson Health System (JHS) is a partnership of healthcare institutions with a history of hundreds of years of excellent patient care and similar objectives and philosophies, JHS brings together the regions premier healthcare institutions — Magee Rehabilitation, Main Line Health and Thomas Jefferson University Hospitals. As the Executive Vice President for Insurance at JHS, Ms. Salter has overall responsibility for the organization and operations of the two captive companies (Mountain Laurel Risk Retention Group and Five Pointe Professional Liability Insurance Company) owned by JHS. She is also responsible for the development and ongoing monitoring of the claims and risk management guidelines established by the Board of the Mountain Laurel Risk Retention Group for the insureds in the program.

In addition she is responsible for the purchasing and administration of any and all of the property and casualty insurance coverages placed for JHS and its Member Organizations. This includes the analysis of commercial and self insurance options and the investigation of cost effective alternatives.

She is the past Chair of the board of the Vermont Captive Insurance Association and is a board member of St. Joseph University Academy of Risk and Insurance and the Insurance Society of Philadelphia. Ms. Salter has a BS from the University of Delaware and a MBA in Finance from La Salle University.
